2025 YEAR IN REVIEW

It was 245 years ago – 1781 – that The Tun® in Philadelphia was razed, after operating in Philadelphia since 1686. Today, The Tun Legacy Foundation is raising funds, supporters, and awareness to ensure that The Tun – and its storied history – are preserved.

Here are the Foundation’s accomplishments in 2025.

FUNDRAISING

More than **4,350 donors** contributed approximately **\$3.02 million** in 2025. To date, the Foundation has raised approximately \$10 million against a total project cost of \$27 million, in the form of cash contributions, pledges, and grants.

The key to the fundraising success has been the involvement of Keystone and Plank Owner Donors, both Individual and Corporate.



Keystone Donors include the **Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, The Timothy T. Day Foundation, the Estate of Fred Smith, Robert and Allison Brink, Patrick and Seiko Dailey, the Pennsylvania Freemasons, and an anonymous donor.**

The Tun® 1775 Club, a fundraising initiative launched at Modern Day Marine in April 2025, was designed to give everyone a cost-effective and meaningful way to contribute to the rebuild. Since April 2025, the 1775 Club has enlisted more than 3,500 members, including donors from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and five international addresses.

GOVERNANCE

The Tun Legacy Foundation Board added General Peter Pace, USMC (Ret.), the sixteenth chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and Gerry Byrne, vice chairman of Penske Media.

The Tun Legacy Foundation Advisory Committee was launched to provide strategic counsel and special knowledge to support the mission. In their volunteer roles, members raise awareness, aid outreach efforts, make introductions to potential donors and supporters, serve as spokespersons, and participate in board meetings as non-voting members.

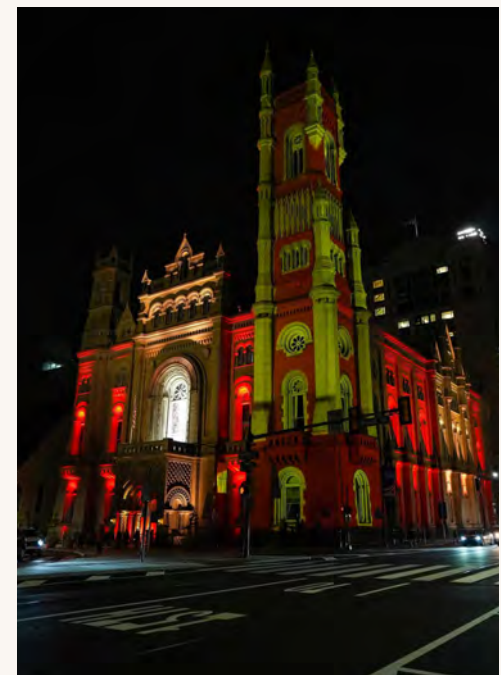

250TH MARINE CORPS BIRTHDAY IN PHILADELPHIA

In celebration of the 250th birthday of the United States Marine Corps on November 10, 2025, in Philadelphia, The Tun Legacy Foundation hosted a dozen events, ranging from block parties to birthday balls, nearly all of which sold out or exceeded attendance. Combined, they attracted more than 15,000 attendees, including visitors from 49 states. Special guests included Medal of Honor Recipients Major General James E. Livingston, USMC (Ret.) and Colonel Harvey Curtiss “Barney” Barnum, Jr., USMC (Ret.).

Corporate sponsors and partners generated more than \$250,000 in commitments and pledges.

MEDIA COVERAGE

Our marketing efforts reached an audience of more than 127 million and generated more than \$4.3 million in publicity.



WEBSITE

Traffic to thetun.org grew by nearly 105,000 visits from 2024 to 2025, an increase of 131.8 percent.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Social media engagement grew on The Tun Legacy Foundation's three platforms – [Facebook](#), [LinkedIn](#) and [Instagram](#) – significantly in 2025. Across all platforms, overall followers grew by 9,817, an increase of 89.9 percent over 2024.

Subscribers to The Tun® Times newsletter grew from 1,021 recipients in 2024 to 6,647 at the end of 2025.
